Once an entry has been made no fees are returnable unless a vets certificate is produced.

There will be a £20 admin charge for these refunds.

**Please note that whilst both NPS Members and Non Members can enter qualifying rounds ONLY the highest placed NPS MEMBER (Standard or Full), on production of their membership card in the Ring, will be eligible to qualify for the Final. A valid membership card must be in the Riders/Handlers possession on entering the Ring. NPS Standard Members will be required to upgrade to Full Members in order to enter the Final.

Stabling:-

PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU BRING YOUR OWN BEDDING/FODDER AS IT WILL <u>NOT</u> BE AVAILABLE ON THE SHOWGROUND.

Gates will be open between 16.00hrs until 19.00hrs on Friday 15th April only.

Stabling will be available from 16.00hrs Friday 15th April 2011 until 18.00hrs on Saturday 16th April 2011 ONLY. Cost:- £30/stable.

Stables will not be available unless booked on the entry form and will be allocated on arrival.

Unauthorised use of stabling will result in a £50 fine per stable.

PRIZES

At the discretion of the Chairman of the Show Committee. Classes which have less than 4 entries may be cancelled or amalgamated.

Prize money will be awarded to the first 3 placed in the NPS Mountain & Moorland Working Hunter Pony Royal International Horse Show Championship Qualifying Rounds (Classes 71-73).

1st £30; 2nd £15; 3rd £10

Prize money shall also be awarded to the first 3 placed in each section of the Winter Championship Finals. $1^{st} £20$; $2^{nd} £15$; $3^{rd} £10$

PRIZE MONEY MUST BE COLLECTED FROM THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE, IN TEME HALL, **ON THE DAY** OF THE SHOW. PRIZE MONEY WILL NOT BE POSTED AFTER THE SHOW. **ROSETTES**

Rosettes will be awarded in all classes to 6th place.

Rosettes will be awarded in the Winter Championship Finals to 10th place.

PROTESTS - Any member or exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest having reference to any person or exhibits shall do so in writing to the Secretary and shall at the same time deposit the sum of £50. The protest shall be considered by a Ground Jury Panel, the members of which have been elected by the Society's Show Committee. If on investigation the protest is not sustained, the deposit may be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All protests not delivered within an hour of the incident will not be considered.

GENERAL DISPUTES - The Chairman of the Show Committee/Vice Chairman, in their absolute discretion may, without assigning any reason, refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted or may decline to admit to the Show Ground any animal or exhibitor or person or withhold any prize. Whenever under this regulation any entry is refused or cancelled, or any exhibit, exhibitor or person is refused admission or is removed, the fees paid for such entry may, at the discretion of the Show Chairman/Vice Chairman, be refunded and if refunded, shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society, its officers, servants or assistants.

The Chairman of the Show Committee/Vice Chairman shall have power to suspend or remove from the Show Ground, at the expense and risk of the person responsible, their stock or property, or anyone who shall infringe any of the Conditions or Regulations of the Society or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards, or whose conduct shall in the opinion of the Chairman of the Show Committee/Vice Chairman be derogatory to the character or prejudicial to the interests of the Society or its members, or who in the opinion of the Chairman of the Show Committee/Vice Chairman have been guilty of any act or omission involving cruelty or unnecessary suffering to, or neglect of, any animal, and all forfeits, fees and charges shall be due by the person responsible before any removal from the Show Ground takes place.

Neither the Society nor any of its officers, servants, or assistants shall be in any way responsible for any loss, injury or damages that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants or assistants or other members of the public, or to any animal or property, or to any vehicle brought into the Show Ground, or on premises used in conjunction with the Show, or while entering or leaving the same, or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Society's Show or Shows or to the Conditions, Regulations or Bye-Laws prescribed by the Society in relation thereto.

Each exhibitor shall abide by and accept as final the decisions of the Judges and Officials of the Show who shall have power in their absolute and controlled discretion to withhold any cup or prize for want of merit or lack of competition in any class or otherwise howsoever.

CLAIMS - Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal (including the spread of any infection or contagious disease) or article exhibited or introduced to the Show Ground by him or her and shall indemnify the Society and its Officials against all actions, proceedings, liabilities, claims, damages and expenses in relation to or arising out of his or her entry or entries in the Show.

GENERAL RULES & SOCIETY'S POWERS - The Chairman of the Show Committee/Vice Chairman reserves the right to change judges after publication of the Show Schedule. The Council of the Society reserves to itself by its Show Committee the sole and overriding power to interpret these and any other prescribed Conditions, Regulations and Bye-Laws, or the terms of any Prize List or Schedule of Show Conditions and to settle and determine all matters, questions or disputes in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to their Show or Shows.

Any animal not sufficiently under control shall be removed from the Show Ring immediately at the request of a Judge or Steward.

Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or assistants or riders and for the consequences of any conduct of such servants or assistants and all persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of the Stewards.

In all Ridden Classes, **unless different rules are stated with the classification**, 6 ponies must be stripped, and others, at the judges discretion, but not necessarily the first 6.

Correctly secured current British standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted and by handlers aged 14 years and under.

ENTRIES ARE ACCEPTED ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT EXHIBITORS HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD THE RULES AND REGULATIONS AS LAID DOWN IN THE 2011 COMPETITION RULES & GENERAL RULES FOR SHOWING.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All exhibits must be registered in the Stud Book or Register of their respective Breed or Type.

All Stallions and Colts two years old and over must hold a current Stallion licence, unless otherwise governed by their individual Breed Society. Two and three year old Colts are to be judged as likely to make future Stallions.

In the case of a false pedigree being given on the entry form any prizes won will be forfeited.

Brood Mares must be four years old and over and must be shown in the ring with own foal at foot which must be at least four weeks old on day of show. A Barren Mare is a mare without a foal at foot in the current season. Mares with live foals born in the current year cannot be entered in Riding, Driving or Working Hunter Pony classes.

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to enter their ponies correctly in the appropriate class. Ponies cannot be transferred, except when measured out, once entries have been accepted.

It is forbidden to administer any stimulant or sedative or any other substance to a pony or cause one to be administered in any way whatsoever with the object of influencing the pony's performance in the Show Ring. The Society reserves the right to conduct Dope Tests in accordance with NPS Competition Rules and General Rules for Showing.

In all classes animals must be sound and healthy. No Veterinary inspection will be required except when considered necessary by the judges or on a protest being lodged. The owner of an animal rejected may, upon application in writing to the Secretary, be furnished with a copy of the Veterinary Certificate. JMB Rules will apply in the event of any dispute relating to the height of a pony.

All exhibitors and persons admitted to the Show Ground shall be subject to the Rules, Bye Laws, Orders, Regulations and Conditions of the Council of the Society.

An Exhibitor may not knowingly exhibit a pony bred, sold, leased, produced, broken or trained by the Judge, and/or his/her immediate family or his/her employer, or by anyone with whom he/she resides.

- (a) A rider/handler may not compete in a Class judged by someone for whom he/she has exhibited in the show ring within the previous 12 months.
- (b) An exhibitor may not show under a judge for whom he or she has produced a pony within the previous 12 months. (An exhibitor is, the owner, the lessee or the person who produces and/or shows the pony).
- (c) An Exhibitor may not show under a Judge where he or she has entered into a financial/ commercial undertaking within the previous 12 months. Stud fees are excluded.

Handlers of Stallions and Colts must have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January of the current year.

There is no age limit for riders in Mountain & Moorland Ridden and Working Hunter Pony classes with the exception of Stallions and Colts in that riders must have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January of the current year when riding small breeds (Shetland, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh A and Welsh B) and their 14th birthday before 1st January of the current year for large breeds (Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D). Riders of stallions in Show Pony/Show Hunter Pony classes must have attained their 11th birthday before the 1st January in the current year for ponies 128 cms (12.2hh) or under, and their 14th birthday when riding stallions exceeding 128cms (12.2hh).

Please note the following regulations in the interests of safety:-

- It is the owner's due diligence to ensure that horses and ponies are not left unattended whilst tied to the side of trailers or lorries.
- Exhibitors are not allowed to set up corrals in the lorry park.
- Dogs must be kept on a lead and under control at all times whilst on the Showground. Please clean up after your dog. The Three Counties Society request that dog waste is picked up off the Showground and disposed of with domestic waste, in a suitable container. Please do not place dog waste with stable manure.
- No smoking is allowed in the stable areas.
- Bicycles, scooters, skateboards etc are not allowed within the Showground. Ponies must only be exercised in the designated areas and must at all times proceed at a walk on the tarmac roadways.
- Sleeping or cooking in the stables is not permitted.
- Please obey the instructions of the Show Committee, Stable Management Team or any other Official at all times.

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ August 2011

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards will check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full membership to enter the final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show

Working Hunter Pony - Riders may only ride one pony in each class

NPS Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony Qualifying Rounds

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are eligible for Ridden classes provided they are registered in a Breed Society Stud Book. Ponies must be plaited.

Qualifying rounds are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ August 2011.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member, and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards will check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full membership to enter the Final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show

NPS Silver Medal Championships

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships

Class 81	Ponies exceeding 128cms and not exceeding 138cms
Class 82	Ponies exceeding 138cms and not exceeding 158cms

Riders any age except stallions (see NPS rules). Pony to be shown in any suitable bridle, boots are not permitted.

This competition will be judged in three phases:

Phase 1 Freestyle show of a maximum of 2 minutes with compulsory elements (to include a rein back, walk on a long rein, three loop canter serpentine with a change of lead, canter extension, lengthened stride at the trot and walk to halt) – 40 marks

Phase 2 Jumping element – three fences – marks for approach, take off, landing – 40 marks

Phase 3 Conformation – 20 marks
